Lesson 5: Publishing and sharing your book.

Description

In this lesson you will publish and share your book.

Background

Publishing a book used to be an extremely long process. Since the digital era began, publishing a book can be done electronically and books can be printed in black and white or in color. Some digital companies provide the option to have your book printed professionally in soft or hard copy. As previously mentioned, Storyjumper.com does provide this options.

Introduction

In this lesson you will publish and share your book. When you publish your book, Storyjumper.com reviews it and then includes it in their library. You also have the option to embed it in your website or blog if you have one, or to allow others to edit copies of your book.

Interface

Once you have finished editing your book, you will save and exit the editing mode. You will be taken to the web page where you can publish and share your book.

Deliverables

In this lesson you will publish and share your book.

You should include the following:

1. Publish your book.
2. Share the link with your instructor and a peer for review.

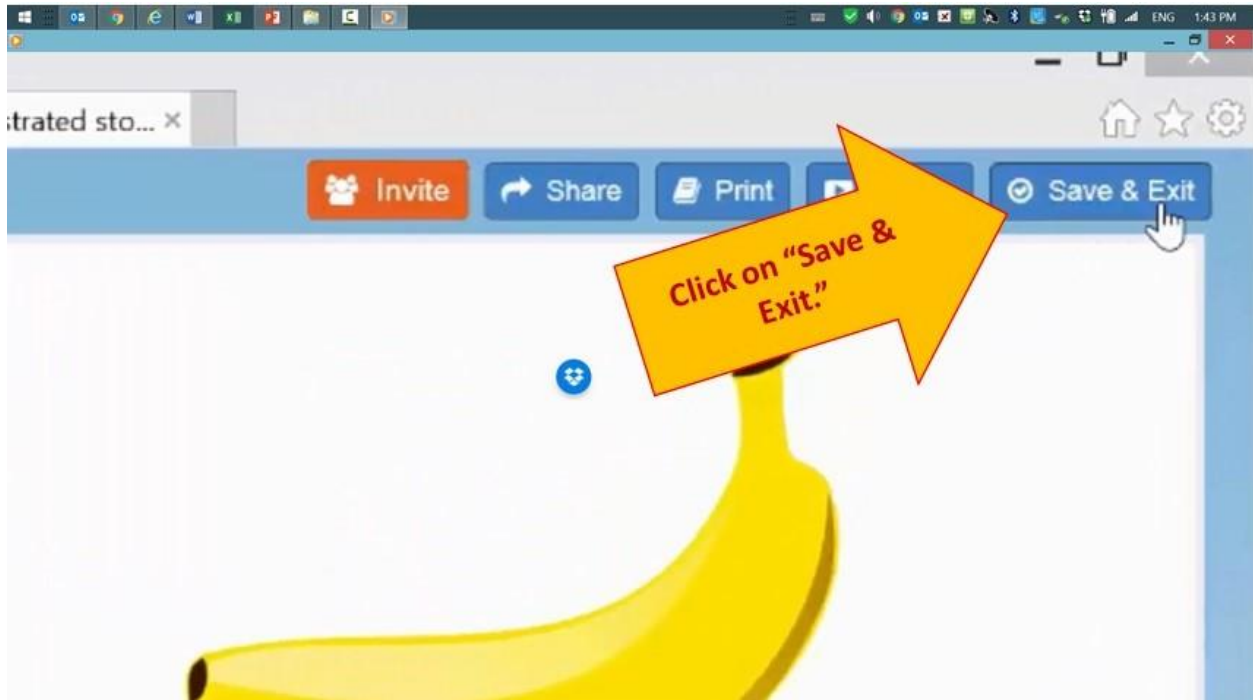

Instructions

Once you have finished editing your book, you will save, exit and then publish and share it.

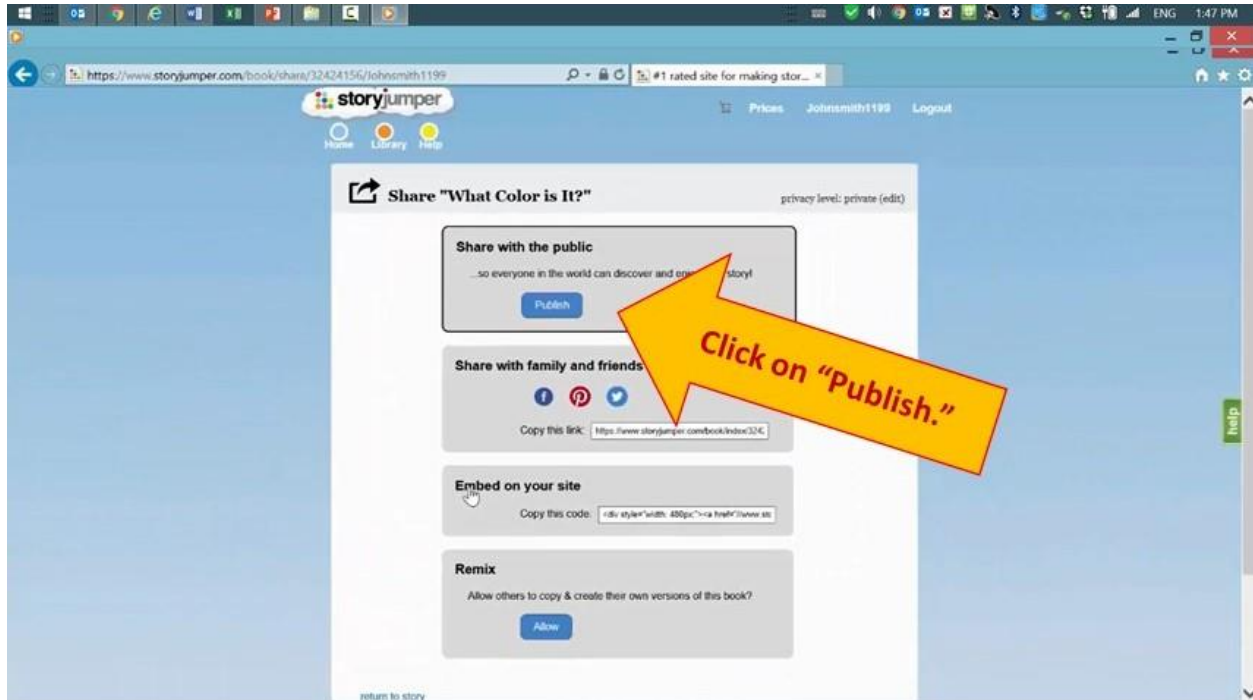
1. Click on the top right corner of your book, where it says "Save & Exit."



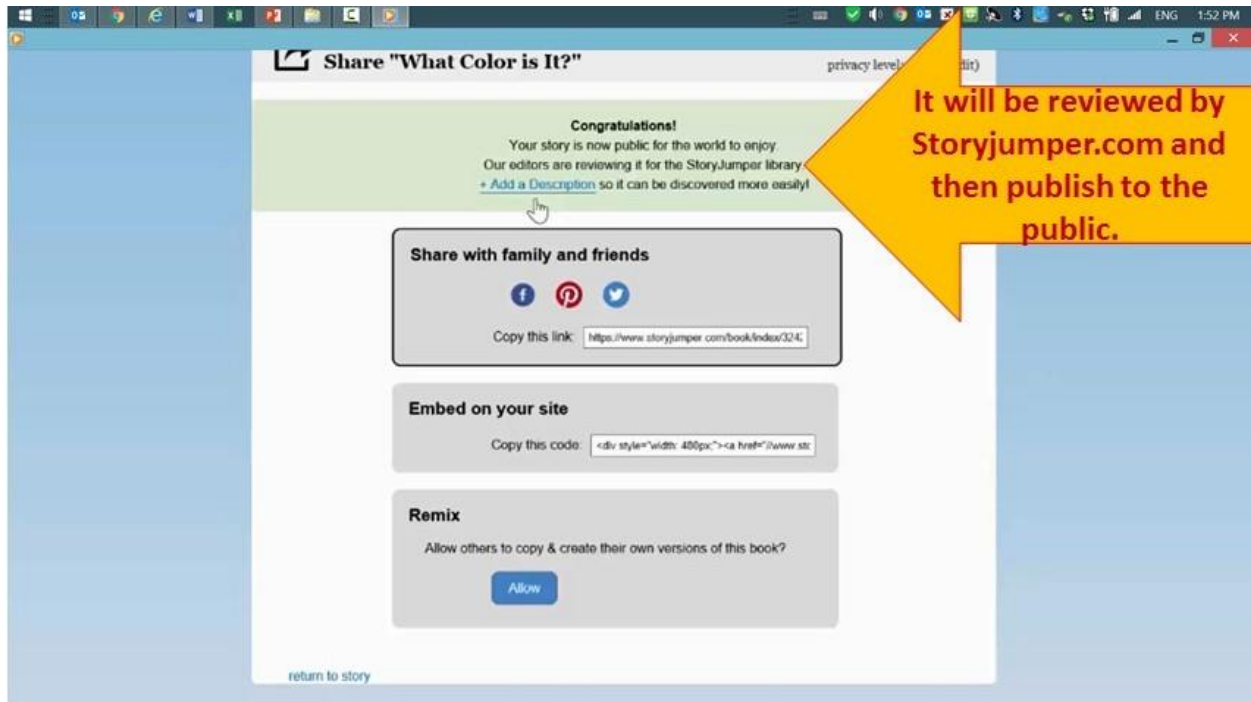
2. Click on "Share."



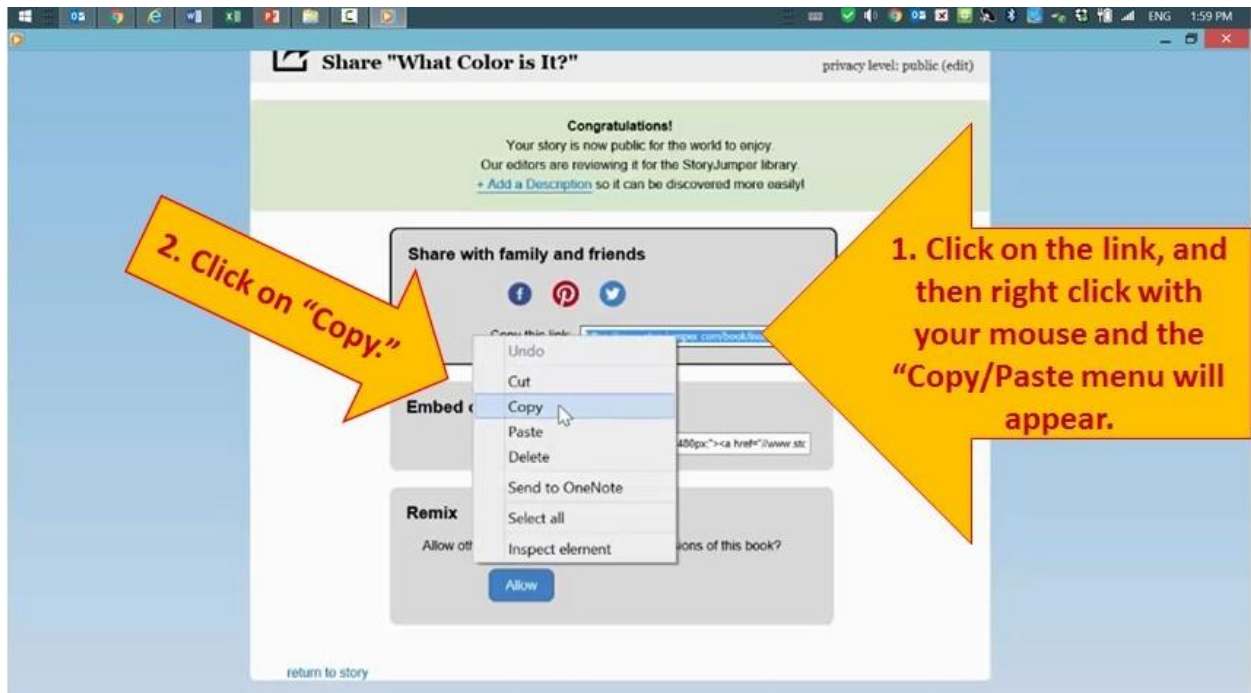
3. Click on "Publish."



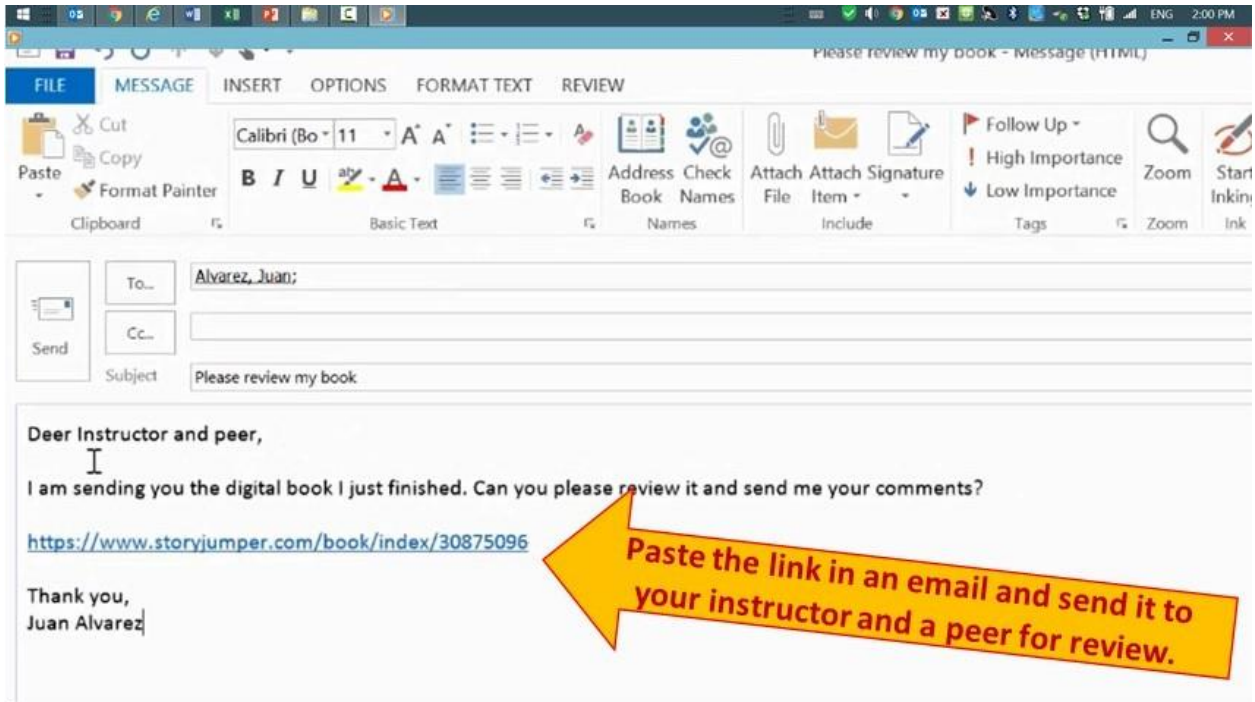
4. Storyjumper.com presents a message saying that your book will be reviewed and included in their library.



5. On the "Share with family and friends" section, click on the link, then right click on it and click on "Copy."
